Bustling Colonial Griffin's Wharf Brought to Life with Actors and Evening of Activities for Kids of all Ages During this 250th Boston Tea Party Anniversary Commemorative Year

BOSTON (June 29, 2023) - As part of this year's 250th Anniversary of the Boston Tea Party commemorative year, the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum, which tells the story of "the single most important event leading up to the American Revolution," is hosting '*Revelry on Griffin's Wharf*' on Sat., July 1, 2023. This event is also part of Boston Harborfest 2023, a hugely popular annual Fourth of July festival in the United States showcasing colonial and maritime heritage and this year's Harborfest also pays homage to the 250th Anniversary of the Boston Tea Party which will be taking place on December 16, 2023. Nearly 3 million people from around the world come to historic Boston for Harborfest annually. Now in its 42nd year, Boston Harborfest is considered to be the largest patriotic Independence Day celebration in the nation (www.bostonharborfest.com).

On the evening of July 1, 2023 from 7:30 pm - 9:30 pm (special evening hours) visitors are invited to 'Revelry on Griffin's Wharf' at the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum, situated over the same body of water where the Boston Tea Party took place nearly 250 years ago (on Dec. 16, 1773), where a bustling Griffin's Wharf is brought to life.

Designed for children and adults, visitors join the Sons and Daughters of Liberty for an evening of history, games, merriment, and all things Boston Tea Party with a special waterfront view of the Boston Harborfest fireworks seen from "Griffin's Wharf' at the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum (taking place at appox. 9:15 pm). The museum's costumed interpreters will engage and educate through interaction and activities including knot tying, Colonial games such as Nine Men's Morris, feather quill writing lessons, tasting the five tea blends that were at the center point of this iconic event and much more. Guests will have access to 18th-century replica vessels *Eleanor* and the *Brig Beaver* and throw tea crates into Boston's historic harbor.

Beer, wine clam chowder, pies, stews, sandwiches, and an assortment of cookies along with many other items will be available for purchase in Abigail's Tea Room.

The Boston Tea Party, "the single most important event leading up to the American Revolution, occurred the night of Dec. 16, 1773. The Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum, owned and operated by Historic Tours of America, is dedicated to accurately reliving and representing a key time in history (1773-1775) through actors, tea throwing reenactments, high-tech interactive exhibits, authentic replica ships: the *Beaver* and the *Eleanor*, and an award-winning multisensory film, *Let it Begin Here*. The Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum is open 7 days/week from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. (Summer/Spring) and from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. (Fall/Winter). Tours run every 30 minutes in the fall/winter and every 15 minutes in the spring/summer and last 1 hr. Closed on Thanksgiving and Christmas Day.
